

"The Egg and I" Hatches In Lab

"The Egg and I," one of the most interesting and certainly one of the most unusual projects ever attempted by biology students, will be presented at Science Fair May 8 through 9.

The project, under the supervision of Mrs. Lyke and her two helpers, Mickey Morton and Larry "Leo" Lisk, concerns the development of the chicken egg. Eggs were placed in an incubator 21 days prior to the fair and will actually be hatching throughout the science show. However, this is only part of the experiment. Each day one egg is being opened in class to observe how far the fertile eggs have developed, and preserved in a container. Thus, when the display is complete it will depict the 21 stages in the hatching of an egg.

Biology students connected with the project hope that it will be one of the main attractions in the Science Fair.
