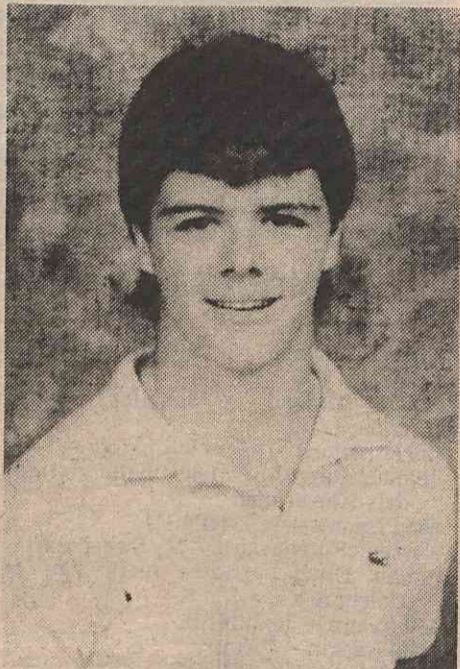
Morehead Nominees Selected

Angie Roach — Tradition will be broken. Go she-boppers!

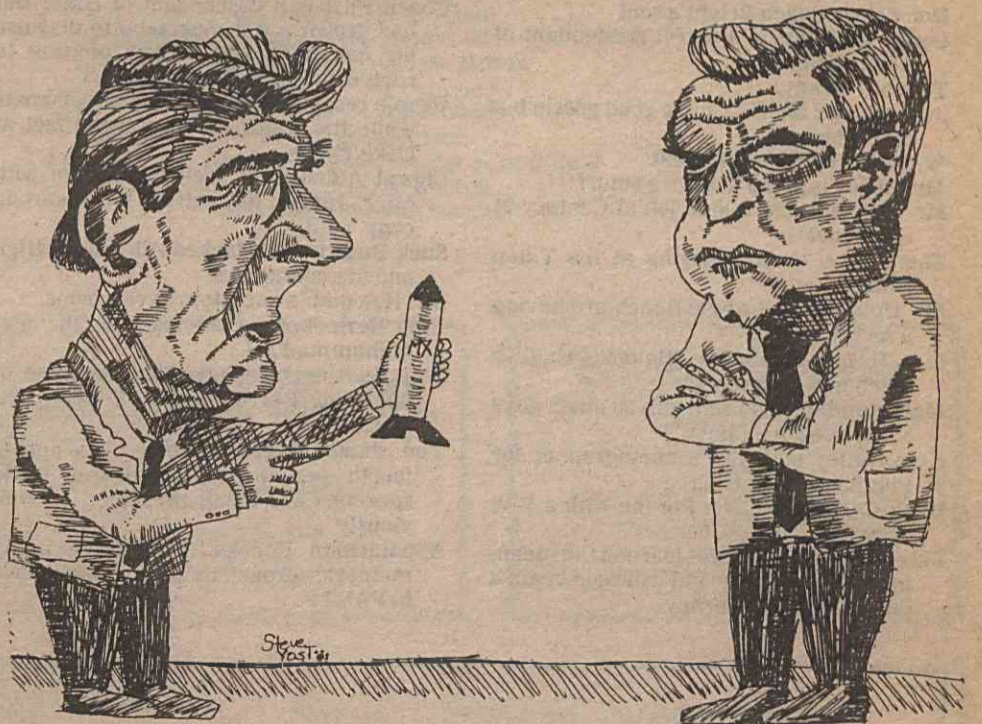
Jennifer Maiden — We don't need luck. Go get 'em juniors!

Poll Conducted At ASHS

Barbara Ward conducted a poll among Albemarle Senior High School students in order to see who would win the 1984 elections. Government students in her classes sent ballots to all homerooms. On these ballots, each student was requested to specify race and gender. Ms. Ward then tallied the votes to obtain the results of the entire student body vote. Government classes also voted individually and were asked also to write why they chose each candidate.

The majority of the students interviewed felt that the mock election was worthwhile

because it gave them a chance to make known their feelings about the candidates.

In the presidential race, Ronald Reagan surpassed Walter Mondale with a vote of 371 to 204. Jim Hunt, with a vote of 296, defeated Senator Jesse Helms who received a vote of 274 in the senatorial bid. In the vote for the House of Representatives, Bill Hefner won over Harris Blake 325 to 248. Jim Martin who received a vote of 317 won against Rufus Edminsten who received a vote of 263.

The Republicans came out ahead in all races except that of the Senate.
