
On Saturday, April 19th, the 1986 Albemarle Senior High School prom was held. The night started at 8:00 p.m. and ended at 12:00 a.m.


The night seemed to end almost as soon as it had started. The last song was played and everyone had to leave one of the best times they had had in a while. Some called it a night, while others were just getting
