HIGHLANDS COMMUNITY THEATRE TO ERECT BUILDING

A theatre building will be constructed to house the production of the recently incorporated Highlands Community Theatre. The use of a lot has been volunteered and several people have contributed such gifts of money that the directors are undertaking to raise the remainder of the \$3,000 necessary for the completion of the project.

The Highlands Community Theatre has been developed by the group which in the past two seasons has successfully produced "Dulcy" and "The Late Christopher Bean."

The organization is non-profit making and is for the entertainment and development of the community. It is anticipated that the completed building will be used for a variety of community activities and programs. The Board of Directors state that contributions, no matter how small, will be welcomed. Visits are being made to all persons indicating their interest in a fuller explanation of the theatre program.

A public meeting to explain this program and to report on its progress to date will be held at Helen's Barn at 3 o'clock Tuesday afternoon, September 10th. The meeting will be open to the public and it is hoped that everyone with an interest in the group's activities will attend.

MONTH OF AUGUST HAS UNUSUAL RAINFALL

The total amount of rainfall for the month of August was 25.57 inches, as reported by Miss Gertrude Harbison, official weather observer at the government station two and a half miles south of Highlands. Of this total amount for the month 12.59 inches fell over a fortyeight hour period on August 12th and 13th, and 11.65 inches fell during a twenty-four hour period August 29 and 30th.
