HOME ECONOMICS TEACHING PLAN

There is no plan as to the order in which the following topics will be taught. Mrs. Miller has planned to cover most and all if possible, of the topics in the following list this year.

A. The first topic is clothing. This has been begun and practically every one of the girls has about finished her garment.

Colors were tried on each girl in order to pick out the colors best suited to each. The sewing machine and its parts were studied. We checked our personality and the personality of other girls in each class.
