

COMMENCEMENT SPEAKER

Charles W. Phillips, Director of Public Relations at the Woman's College of the University of North Carolina, with the rank of professor, who will speak at the commencement services tonight, has been outstanding in the educational civic, social welfare, and religious life of the state for a number of years. He is in constant demand as a speaker in the interpretation of problems in these and other fields.

A native of North Carolina and a graduate of the University, he received the M.A. degree in education at Columbia University. He is a World War I veteran. He taught in the Greensboro City Schools and for ten years was principal of an elementary and then the city high school.

He has long served as a member of the Board of Stewards of West Market Street Methodist Church in Greensboro and as a teacher of a men's Bible Class. His leadership in civic affairs has included the presidency of the Greensboro Council of Social Agencies and the chairmanship of the Guilford County Board of Welfare.
