Sec. 10. No member shall hold more than one office in the Association at the same time. No member is eligible for office whose record for the preceding semester is not free rom conditions and fallures.
Sec. 11. Nominations for president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, head of hiking, and head of temnis shall be made at the April meeting. There shall be at least three nominees for each office, two of whom shall have been recommended by the Executive Board. The nominees shall be voted upon in turn, by ballot at the May meeting.
Sec. 12. All officers and the heads of hiking and tennis shall enter upon the duties of their respective offices upon election.
Sec. 13. A plurality of votes cast shall elect all officers of the association.
