### Science Club Hears Botany Professor

Dr. D. B. Anderson, professor of botany at North Carolina State college, spoke informally to the members of the Barber Science Club on November 16 on the subject of tobacco plant physiology and his research on the tobacco leaf sucker. He illustrated his talk with slides dealing with the research he is doing in that line and discussed methods of preventing the growth on tobacco of the parasites which absorb strength from the leaves and damage the crop.

Dr. Anderson is at present engaged in the second revision of the textbook on *Plant Physiology* of which he is co-author with Dr. Myer of Ohio State college.

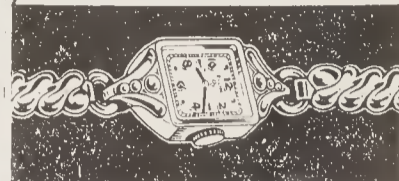

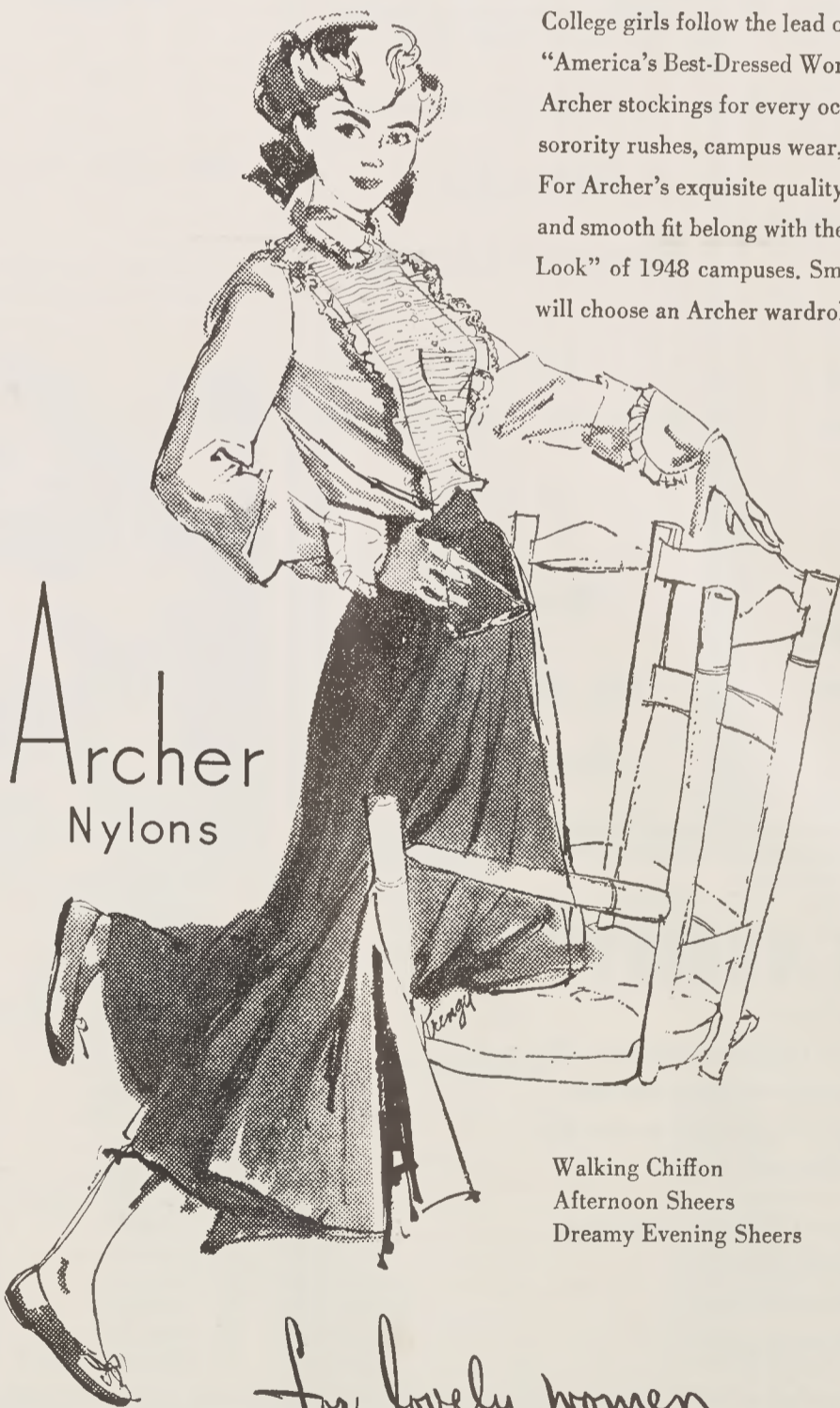
