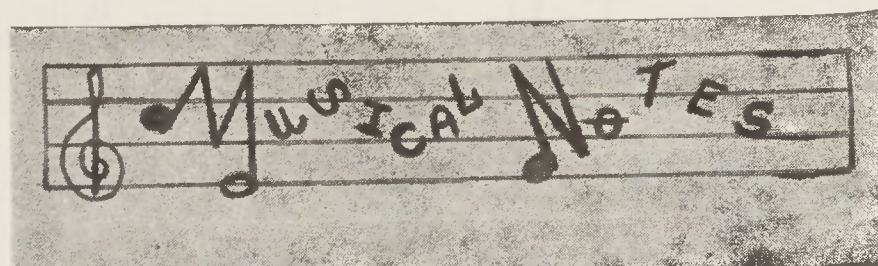
ALUMNAE HAPPENINGS


