

# Horse Show Will Feature Six Classes Today

## BEGINNERS, ADVANCED RIDERS TO TAKE PART

The annual college Horse Show will begin at 2:00 this afternoon at the riding ring and will feature riders from both beginning and advanced classes. Meredith stables are famous for fine horses, and today's show promises to be rewarding for all spectators.

Mrs. Miriam Todd Hitt, riding instructor, has announced that six classes will be entered in the show, including three walk-trot classes and an intermediate class, displaying their skills with the walk, trot, canter, leads, and diagonals.

For the advanced riders, the experienced students will demonstrate cantering on the straightaway and change horses with each other. For the first time this year, a beginning jumping class is added to the program.

Four ribbons will be presented to each class. Betty Bronson, of the Pine Knoll Stables in Durham, will judge the competition, and Joe Barber, of Raleigh, will announce the events.

Riders in the show will be judged only for horsemanship, including such points as correct diagonals and leads, position of the hands and feet, and general ease of the rider.

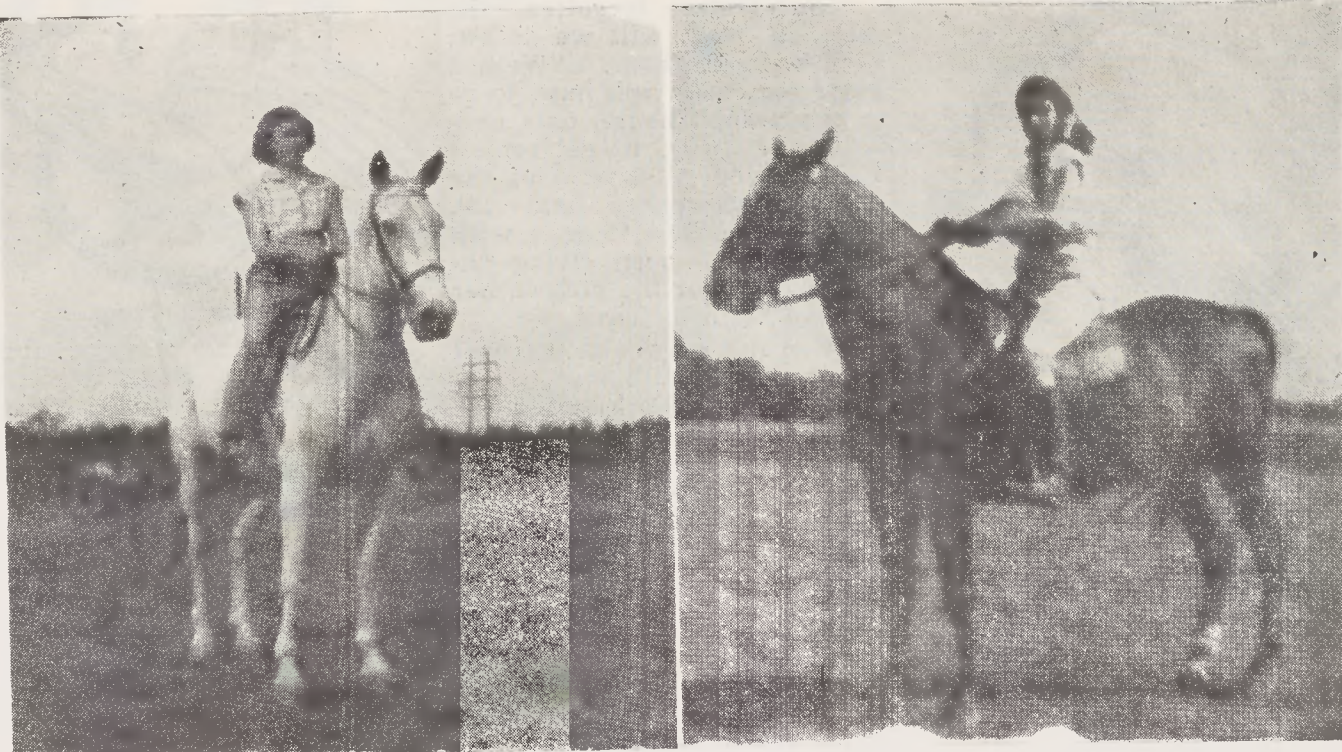
