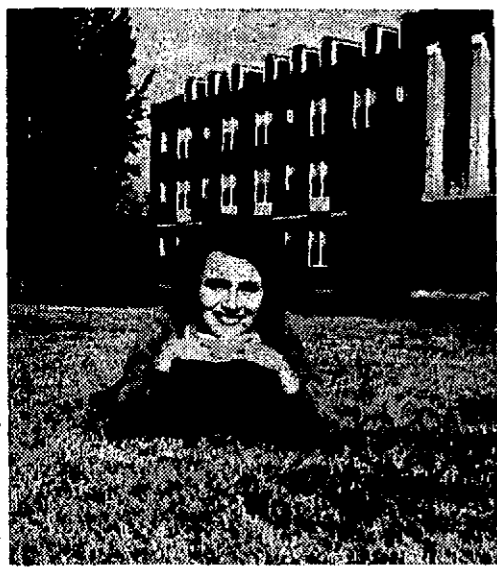
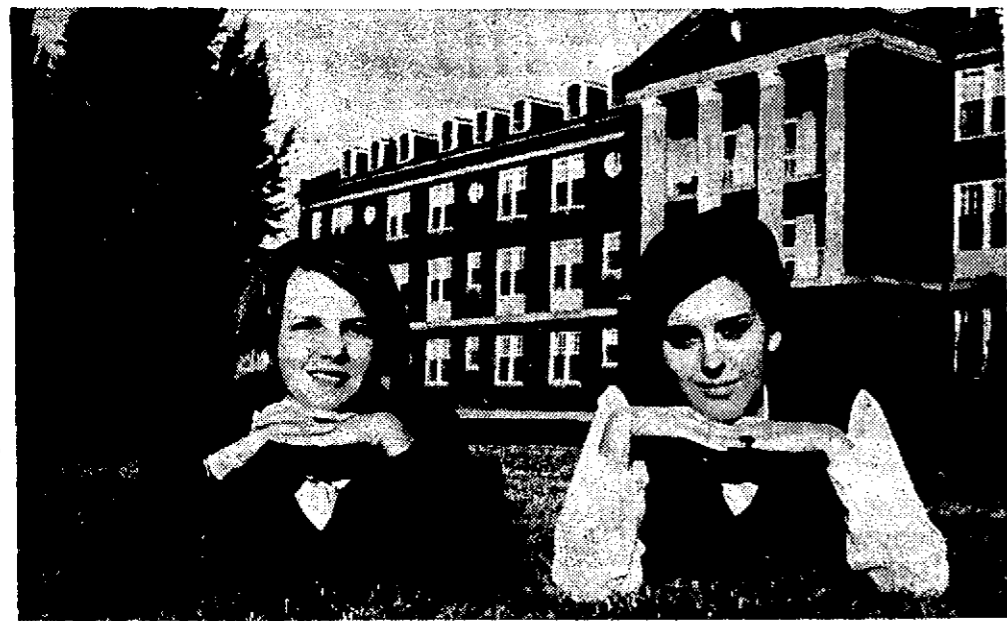


# Classes Choose May Court

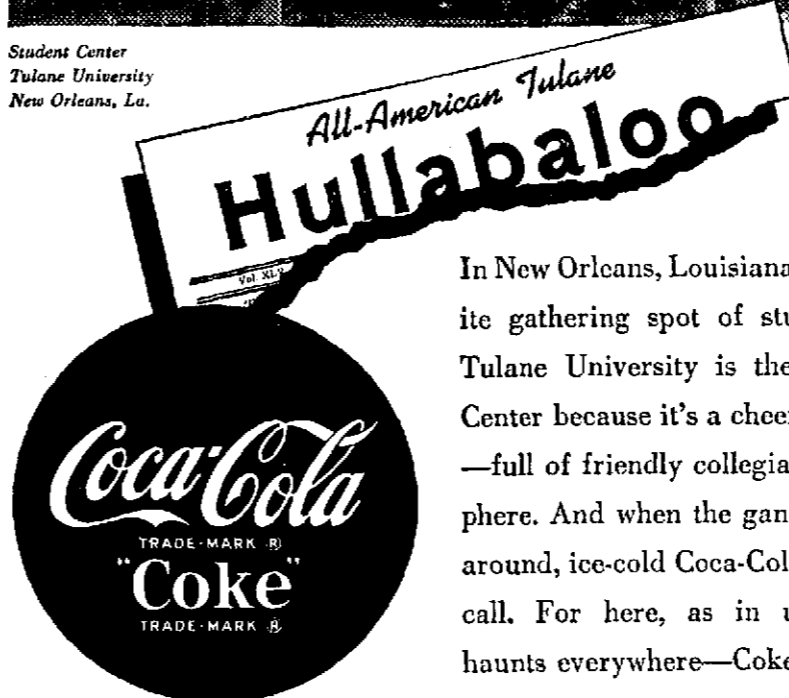
