Newspaper Internship
Some of the nation's top newspapers are offering summer internships to college students through the Newspaper Funds Internship Program.
Two types of internships are offered: The Editing

Internships puts selected students to work on the copy desk of a daily newspaper or wire service.
Prior to the internship, each student must attend an intensive copyediting training course at a university designated by the Fund. (The

course is paid for by the Fund.)
The Reporting Internship involves full-time reporting or news gathering work.
Both programs offer a salary paid by the individual newspaper and a scholarship of \$500-\$700. Forms to request applications may be obtained from Career Planning Services. The deadline for all entries is December 1.
