Office of Continuing Education

The Medieval Festival was a wonderful way to become acquainted with the Middle Ages - with the spiritual order of the times as well as the realities of daily life - and with the ongoing human struggles to reconcile the two.

Now, the Office of Continuing Education invites you to step into the next period of Western history with a look at the Renaissance and Reformation. Beginning on October 3, and continuing on Monday evenings thereafter through November 14, a free lecture series entitled, "The Human

Dimension," will focus on what has been described as "the voyage from the medieval world into our modern universe." Topics to be included are the evolution of humanism; the coming of a money economy and material wealth; artistic endeavor; church reform; science and exploration; and the development of literature. All programs are scheduled for 103 Joyner at 7:30 p.m. and feature distinguished speakers from North Carolina college campuses.

As sophomores, juniors, and seniors are aware, and as fresh(women) are no doubt discovering, a student at Meredith has many opportunities to learn without ever going to a single class! While we are certainly not suggesting you do that, it is true that the special events and

activities you choose to attend can also be important to your education. We think this series is in that category.

This week the Office of Continuing Education is sponsoring two programs about which Meredith students may want to know. The first is a two-hour workshop titled "What is a Paralegal." This workshop will meet on Tuesday, October 11 in Joyner Lounge and will be free of charge. Any one considering a paralegal program is urged to attend.

The Paralegal field is growing and is receiving a great deal of publicity but there are still many people who are uncertain about what a paralegal is. This workshop is designed to consider the duties performed by paralegals in

various office situations and to provide information and to answer questions for those interested in a career as a legal assistant. Topics to be discussed are: educational background required for paralegals, types of paralegal programs available, professional skills needed by paralegals, career opportunities for paralegals, and the admissions process for the Meredith College Legal Assistants Program.

The other program, which is also free of charge, is "An Evening at Meredith" which will begin at four o'clock on Wednesday, October 12 in the Commons Room of the Chapel. The purpose of this evening is to acquaint women who are older than the traditional college age with Meredith College and the Meredith Program.

Women attending the session may choose to attend a discussion on entering or reentering college, attend a discussion on entering a graduate program, visit an undergraduate college class, or visit a Legal Assistants Program class.

Dinner in the President's Dining Room will precede the discussion and class time. Several Meredith students and faculty members will be available for conversation during dinner. If you know someone who has expressed an interest in going back to school, be sure to tell them about this program and have them to call the Office of Continuing Education to make arrangements to attend. Please help us to make these women feel welcome as they tour the campus, visit the dining room, and visit classes.
