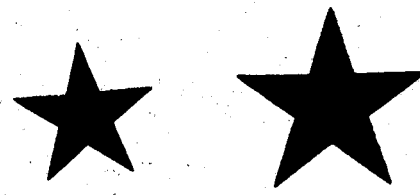

Hiott encouraged students to come and speak with him if they felt that they qualified for assistance. He also stated that the office is willing to work with students who meet financial difficulties during the year.

Hiott pointed out there is money available for graduate students who are eligible for assistance. The money is in the form of loans and is not grant money.

To apply for financial assistance, a student must complete the required

financial forms available at Meredith before December 19, 1985. The forms must be completed and mailed before February 15, 1986. Dates of notification of awards depend upon a student's classification and the date of application. The assistance is applicable toward the following school year.

If a student has questions or needs, further information may be obtained through an appointment with the Office of Scholarships and Financial Assistance.
