Some Facts On Hunger

Experts disagree about the precise dimensions of the hunger problem, but all agree that the problem has reached catastrophic proportions:

- Between 13 and 20 million people die each year as a result of hunger and starvation. That breaks down to about 40,000 deaths per day and more than 25 per minute. Three out of every four who die are children.

- More than 500 million people suffer from chronic malnutrition, with some estimates placing the number as high as one billion. That's between 10 and 20 percent of the world's population. By

even the most conservative estimates, the number of people suffering from chronic malnutrition is more than double

the population of the United States. With the exception of a large-scale nuclear war, there is no other type of disaster that even approaches hunger as a threat to human life:

- More people have died of hunger in the past five years than have been killed in all the wars of the last 150 years.

 The worst natural disaster in modern history -- a 1976 earthquake in China -- killed 242,000 people. Hunger takes that many lives every week.
