File of Life Available

This File of Life is a handy little magnetic holder that contains a form that can be filled out with an individual's doctor's name, medical data (including current medications and allergies), emergency contact phone numbers, existence of medical directives and other pertinent information. There's even room to keep a separate list of current medications, which may need updating more frequently than the rest of the information. Once completed, the form folds neatly inside the holder, which can be placed on the refrigerator for emergency responders' use. The File of Life holders are available to Pine Knoll Shores residents at the public safety building and at town hall. Stop by and pick up one, complete the form and place it on your refrigerator—and be sure to keep it up to date as your situation changes. Complete and display it *before* an emergency occurs; it may speak for you at a time when you cannot.
