

construction in Pine Knoll Shores and 117 condominium units.

He also said two applicants for the position of building inspector have been completed. Bob Hope, incumbent building inspector, plans to retire in December.

Commissioner Thompson, in his police report, requested that residents and contractors who leave building materials along street right of ways, make certain they are properly lighted, since they pose a traffic hazard.

Finally, Mayor Cleveland read a letter from the Department of Transportation announcing plans for the third bridge between Morehead City and Atlantic Beach. The Board agreed to support the proposal assuming further traffic studies were conducted.

On September 28, the Board held a special meeting to discuss a replacement for the Planning Board Chairman and codification of town ordinances. It was pointed out that in view of the illness of Planning Board Chairman Curt Johnson that Luke Hargroves be requested to function as acting Planning Board Chairman.

It was decided, with respect to the codification of the Town Ordinances, that the bid of Coded Systems, of New Jersey, be accepted.

RESOLVED, that notice hereof shall be given by publishing a copy of this Resolution in the October, 1982 edition of The Shore Line; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Police Department of the Town of Pine Knoll Shores be requested to assist the [Association or Corporation] in enforcing said prohibition."
