

PINE KNOLL SHORES RADIO EXERCISE

As part of its ongoing program to be prepared to cope with the after-effects of a disastrous hurricane, the town is conducting a radio communications exercise on June 25th. The Police and Fire Departments, Civil Preparedness Directorate, Rescue Squad, and Town Officials will participate.

The objectives of the exercise are:

1. To test the effectiveness of the town's radios in various locations.
2. To challenge the ability of department chiefs to control their activities by radio under simulated conditions of a disaster. And
3. To provide the participants with training and practice in the operation of radio voice communications.

Realistic situations requiring participants to move from place to place have been written into an exercise scenario. Graphic descriptions of casualties and damage may startle outside listeners on VHF scanners and citizen band radios. Be assured, it is all fictional. The exercise will be cancelled if there is an immediate threat of an actual hurricane.

This communications exercise is another first for Pine Knoll Shores in Carteret County. It is indicative of the Town's continuing concern for the safety and well-being of its residents and visitors.
