Also during the year Town Commissioners were reported in the ShoreLine as: accepting the gift of about 5 acres on Pine Knoll Boulevard from the Roosevelt partnership, Inc. with restrictions as to its development; acquiring beach access near Holiday Inn and purchasing a 4-wheel drive vehicle to make it worthwhile; amending the zoning ordinance to limit the use of non-conforming properties, and amending the sign ordinance allowing certain signs such as "Yard Sale" and "Open House" under controlled conditions; and passing an ordinance requiring street numbers to be posted on
