Commissioner Blanchard reports that he has received many favorable comments on the new street name signs. Several street name signs have been ordered that were not included in the first order.

#### FINANCE

Commissioner Gallo reports that 7.6% of budgeted revenues have been received while 15% of budget expenditures have been distributred. Revenues from room tax and sales tax were up a little. Investments average a rate of 2.8% Tax bills should be out by September 15, and citizens are urged to pay early although taxes can be paid at par through January 5th.
