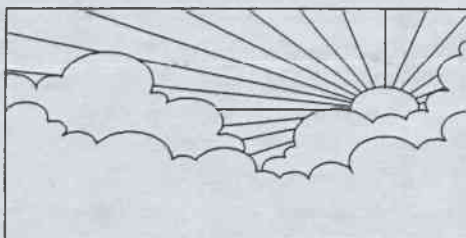
Now In Effect!
