

### USE OF STREET RIGHT OF WAY

An owner of property may place and maintain on the right of way, posts, fences, walls, stakes or other obstructions not more than three (3) feet high, and may plant or maintain trees and shrubs on such right of way, provided that none of these items may be placed, planted, or permitted to remain within six (6) feet of the paved surface of any public street. Any overhang from plantings may not protrude within six (6) feet of the paved surface, or stand no more than ten (10) feet high.

All EMT-D's were reminded to schedule their ER time for the quarter.



### From Chief of Police Crawford:


