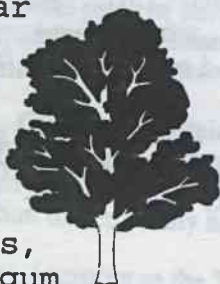

UNWANTED NEW RESIDENTS

Again this year residents have been concerned with the black twig borer, which is causing continued damage to our native dogwoods, magnolias, holly, oak and gum trees. The damage has now spread to all of Bogue Banks and parts of Morehead City. Ray Harris, Carteret County Extension Service, has been asked for advice on this pest. He advises this pest may be removed by pruning out the affected parts. Spraying on private property is allowed, using Dursban.
