WATER PROJECT

During the past few months, Pine knoll Shores has been providing information to its citizens regarding the ongoing process of building or purchasing a water system. Despite the several public hearings and much public discussion, some confusion continues as to the upcoming bond referendum.

Whether the Town purchases the existing water system or builds a new water system, funds will need to be borrowed. In order to borrow The funds, the Town must purchase bonds, which must be approved in advance by the vote of the citizens of the Town.

There are two available categories of bonds - Tax Bonds or Revenue Bonds. Tax Bonds are the preferred type of Bond, because interest rates are typically approximately one-half percent lower than
