The health topic this month concerns <u>drug names</u>. There are more than 10,000 names for the prescription drugs marketed in the United States. Plus, there are thousands of names for over-the-counter drugs.

- Problem: Many of these names sound the same, and can be confused by doctors, pharmacists and patients.
- Examples: Amrinone and Amiodarone; retrovir and ritonavic; and celebrex and celexa. The similarity in the names of the first two drugs has already resulted in several deaths.

It is hoped that new computer programs can give the U.S. Food and Drug Administration more ammunition when debating proposed drug names with manufacturers and help flag potential problems.

Make sure your doctor <u>clearly types</u> or <u>prints</u> the name of your prescription drug on the prescription form and notes what it is for. Be clear, yourself, exactly what you are taking. Source Journal of American Medical Association, Vol. 281, No. 15.
