Yard Waste Collection -Reminder

To better serve residents, the Pine Knoll Shores Department of Public Services will begin collecting yard waste two times in each month, beginning in April. Yard waste will be collected on the second Tuesday and the last Tuesday of each month. This schedule will remain in effect throughout the entire year.

The guidelines for yard waste preparation will remain the same. It is requested that residents comply with the guidelines so this material can be collected in a timely and cost effective manner. Copies of the guidelines are available at the town hall.

To maintain the neat appearance of the town's streets, no yard waste may be placed at the roadside earlier than seventy-two hours (three days) before the scheduled collection dates.
