I hope you all had a great Christmas, and I wish you all the best for 2012. Here are a few things going on in town:

Getting "In the Know" in PKS Local Government. Each year the mayor and Board of Commissioners meet for two days in February to talk about the upcoming year. We call this our Strategic Planning Session. I think it is one of the best ways for an interested citizen to find out where priorities lay, what is the focus of government and to find out generally what's important in Pine Knoll Shores. Keep an eye out for the dates. This is a public meeting open to all.

Mimosa Bridge. We had a bid opening on December 13. The contractor that was selected will start work in the latter part of January. It appears that the timeline for the project will be less than originally expected, so we are optimistic that we will meet our objective of having all of the work done by Memorial Day 2012.

Sidewalks. As of the time of this writing, the North Carolina Department of Transportation (DOT) is still reviewing our updated design. The update, as mentioned in last month's paper, involves moving the sidewalk further off the asphalt of Salter Path Road - that is, as far into the DOT right-of-way as possible. This update will likely require more bulk heading, which we want to avoid. I am collecting an updated construction estimate, which I will present to the Board of Commissioners in short order.
