This year's theme, Animals on the Edge, spotlights imperiled species and how to protect them. The aquarium's daily programs focus on amphibians, sharks, alligators, birds and turtles. There will be cash prizes in three divisions (professional, amateur, and junior amateur) with a taste testing at 3:30 p.m. on April 13.

Hundreds of millions of people from over one hundred different countries will switch off the lights to bring awareness to global environmental issues.

Fashioned after Williamsburg of the 1700s when the General Court was in session, Publick Day gave visitors from far and wide an opportunity to come to town to see and be seen, conduct court business, shop, gossip, dine and dance. 
