

## YMCA Sports Parade

On January 8, Leaksville Mills defeated Leaksville Building Supply 38 to 34 in a closely played game. Joe Talbert and "Bones" Hundley tied for individual high for Leaksville with 10 points each, and Bill Edwards was high scorer for Leaksville Building Supply with 9 points.

Aimes, Iowa. He was with the acetate division of Du Pont at Waynesboro, Va. from 1930 until 1947. He began as a student operator and worked through the plant. He later served in a supervisory capacity in the chemical, spinning and service departments.

He went on active duty as a lieutenant in the Navy in August 1944 and served until 1946, a part of the time in the Pacific theatre of operations. He was attached to the Office of Research and Invention and did a great deal of development work on the tropic-proofing of equipment and supplies. He returned to Du Pont upon his retirement from naval service and remained there until coming with Fieldcrest.
