1,653 Employees Get Free Chest X-rays

A total of 1,653 Fieldcrest employees received free chest check-ups. A private report will be mailed soon by the County Health Department to each individual who had a chest X-ray.

The free X-ray service was provided through the joint efforts of the County Health Department, Fieldcrest Mills and the State Board of Health. Such X-ray surveys have also been conducted at the Fieldale, Va., and Draper mills
