Total Of 24 Plants In County Enroll In Payroll Savings Plan

Macon P. Miller, U. S. Savings Bonds Industrial Committee chairman for Rockingham County has announced successful completion of the drive to enroll the industrial plants of Rockingham County in the Payroll Savings Plan for the purchase of U.S. Savings Bonds. This drive is the first stage of a program aimed at enrolling 25% of Rockingham County industrial employees in the Payroll Savings Plan.

The number of plants who have agreed to make the plain available to their employees has increased from 6 at the beginning of the drive to 24 at the present time. These 24 firms, each employing 50 or more persons, will make the Payroll Savings Plan available to practically every one of the 7,889 industrial workers in the county.

The second stage of the program will be the canvassing of all employees in the above 24 plants in order that all who wish to do so may sign up for this systematic, convenient method of savings. Canvasses of employees will begin immediately.
