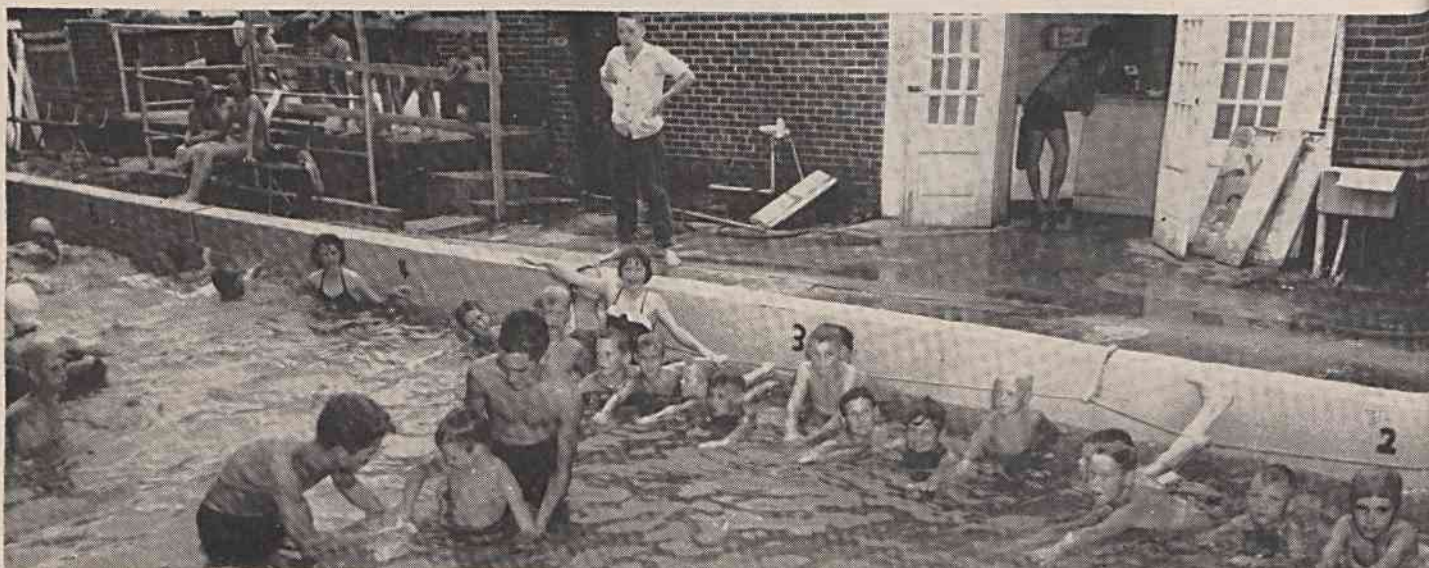

## Hundreds Enjoying 'Y' Summer Program

Consolidated Central Y.M.C.A.'s summer recreational program is in swing with a wide variety of activities offered under the supervision of summer staff. Paul L. Peterson, general secretary, said the varied program designed to provide wholesome recreation during summer for boys and girls of all age groups and for men and women.

Twenty softball teams are participating in the various leagues. Softball is available for boys of all ages and girls is the Commercial League for men. In addition, there are four girls softball teams.

A playground program for young boys and girls is sponsored at the Central Recreation park and the Leaksville playground. Day camping for two weeks have been held, both boys and girls with 75 youngsters attending the two camps.

High interest has been shown in tennis since the Leaksville-Spray Y's M.C. club completed two new lighted courts at Central Recreation park. A tennis tournament is being planned for this month for men and women and boys and girls. The lighted horse courts have attracted their share of votes, and plans also are under way for a horseshoe tournament.

Swimming classes at the New Leaksville pool are continuing both for children and adults. More than 500 youngsters already have learned to swim and additional large classes now enroll. Swimming classes are held in the evenings for young adults with another class for young women being conducted three mornings a week.
