



Rugs Chosen For Exhibit In Museums

Karastan's "Oasis" and "Night Flowers" designs of the Desert Collection of area rugs have been selected for display in two American museums and will be shown across the nation in a traveling exhibit.

The Company was notified that the two rugs have been accepted in "California Designed", an exhibition of the best of new California home furnishings designs publicizing California's style of living on a national scale.

The rugs will be used by the M. H. De Young Memorial Museum in a joint exhibition opening simultaneously in Southern California at the Municipal Art Center in Long Beach and at the M. H. De Young Memorial Museum in San Francisco in Northern California. The openings of the exhibitions are set for July 10 to coincide with the summer furniture and accessories markets on the west coast.

National circulation by the American Federation of Arts will follow, causing the exhibit to become a traveling show. Intensive state-wide publicity will cover 550 newspapers, 100 trade publications, 3600 retailers and at least 1,000 designers. The local campaign will be followed by nationwide publicity, including an illustrated catalog which will be widely distributed.
