consolidation of the staff departments and office operations and alleviates the parking situation which had become critical for employees of the Finishing Mill and Bleachery.

From the front entrance, the area to the right is occupied by the Comptroller's Department, Accounting, Cost, Payroll, Service Department, and by the Standards Department. On the left are the Purchasing, Engineering, and Data Processing Departments. An entrance from the west parking area leads to the Industrial Relations Department, Employment Office, Training Department and Medical Department. There also is a side entrance directly to the Medical Department.

The lobby of the building has a terrazzo floor with walls of glass, plaster, and exposed brick. Most of the offices have asphalt tile floors and accoustical tile ceilings. Generally, they have window walls with exposed brick or block and movable metal partitions.
