Your Social Security — Questions And Answers

- Q. My husband died last month. We have not lived together in five years due to domestic difficulties. There are no minor children and I am 49 years old. I paid the burial expenses. When I am 62 years old, will I be eligible for widow's benefits?
- A. Yes, unless your own Social Security benefit equals or exceeds the amount of your widow's benefits. In addition, since you paid the burial expenses, you will be entitled to the lump sum death payment if you make application within two years from the date of your husband's death. You will need an itemized, receipted funeral bill, and proof of death. The lump sum is paid without regard to age.
- Q. How soon should a person contact their Social Security office to file a claim for benefits?
- A. Six weeks before retirement age, 62 for women, 65 for men, should give you a good start.
- Q. I have two different Social Security numbers. Am I supposed to have both of them?
- A. Absolutely not. Get in touch with your Social Security office right away, and take both numbers with you. Your wages may not be properly reported if you have more than one number.
- Q. I am nearing retirement age. I don't have a birth certificate. What should I do?
- A. You could establish your age with any one of the following. An old family Bible, insurance policy, army

- Q. My husband passed away recently. He worked under Social Security from 1937 until he died. I am 50 years old and have one child under 18 by our marriage. My husband and I have always lived together. When I apply for benefits—what do I need to bring to the Social Security office?
- A. You will be asked for a birth certificate for your minor child, a marriage record and a death certificate.
