

Morris Takes Over Duties At Greenville



Henry F. Morris, former manager of Philadelphia, Pa., a large supplier of Karastan's woolen yarn for many years, has assumed his duties as manager of our Karastan Spinning Division at Greenville.

The woolen spinning plant at Greenville, formerly the Greenville Mills, Inc. was purchased by Fieldcrest Mills, Inc. last July for the manufacture of wool and synthetic carpet yarns on the woolen system.

Mr. Morris has moved his residence to Greenville and is in charge of all manufacturing operations, reporting to Robert A. Harris, vice president, manufacturing. In addition to his mill activities, Mr. Morris purchases all carpet yarn under the direction of Stiles R. Field, vice president, purchasing.

Well-Known To Company Men
A graduate of the Philadelphia Textile Institute, Mr. Morris has been in the carpet yarn and carpet manufacturing business since 1927. He has been well and favorably known to Fieldcrest and Karastan officials for many years. In commenting on the appointment, Harold W. Whitcomb, president of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc., said, "Fieldcrest is delighted to have Mr. Morris join our company in this capacity since he is known to be one of the best men in the industry."

A native of Philadelphia, Mr. Morris was associated with Kitchen & Co., of Philadelphia, in the wool importing business for five years. From 1927 until 1935 he had his own yarn manufacturing business, the H. F. Morris Co. For the next 13 years he was with the Mercer Yarn Co., Philadelphia, and Frank S. Nelson & Co., Inc. in 1948, remaining until he resigned to join Fieldcrest Mills, Inc.

Mr. Morris is married and has a son who is married and twin daughters who graduated from college in June, 1960.

Quality Program Hits High Mark

The quality weavers recognition program at the Blanket Mill has reached an all-time high mark with 26 weavers making the honor list for the six months ending August 31.

Six new names were added to the quality list of plain or dobby weavers. These were Addie Carter, Drewey Chilton, W. J. Combs, Kate Fuller, Dahlia McBride and Garland Samuels.

Five new names on the jacquard quality list were Lee Roy Brown, Homer Hardin, Gladys Harris, John Morris and Junior William Sanders.

At the end of August three second shift weavers had attained exceptional records by working 18 consecutive months without a major quality defect in their cloth. These weavers were Lessie Chilton, Otra Chilton and Mattie Hall.

The listing of the quality weavers is part of a program at the Blanket Mill designed to emphasize the importance of quality weaving and to give recognition to weavers with outstanding records.

In order to make the quality honor list, a weaver must work for six months without a major quality defect.

When a weaver on the list has a major quality defect, his name is dropped from the list. Other weavers are added as they attain six months of quality work.

The quality honor list for the six months ending August 31 is shown in the accompanying box.

The "Weavers of the Week" are those with the lowest percentage of seconds with respect to the standards for the various loom groups.
