If 15 per cent of the employee company employing more than 100 sons give blood once each six m the blood needs of all the employ that company will be met through Blood Program and no replacement be necessary.

For companies employing fewe 1000 people, it will be necessari 20 per cent of the employees to blood each six months to qualify

An individual outside of an en group who donates blood to the mobile will receive a card which titles him and his immediate family dependents to blood as needed to next six months.

Persons who are not employed company participating in the Credit plan, or who do not hold dividual credit cards, will be ask replace blood used on a pint-for basis.
