the local hospital without any charge for the blood itself and without having to replace it.

The Bloodmobile is scheduled to come to the Tri-Cities every two months, rotating its visits from Leaksville to Spray to Draper. The next visit will be May 24 in the basement of the First Methodist Church at Draper.

The blood collected is processed at Charlotte and blood and its derivatives are supplied the local hospital from the Charlotte Center.

B. F. Dunton, assistant purchasing agent at Fieldcrest, is general chairman of the Bloodmobile program for the Leaksville - Spray - Draper Red Cross chapter. Raymond Martin, Leaksville insurance man, is the donor recruitment chairman.

In commenting on the Blood Program, Mr. Dunton said: "The response of local people indicates that they are solidly behind this program and that they want it continued. While we had hoped to get a few more donors than we actually had on this latest visit, we are highly pleased with the results of the first visit to Spray."
