

Fall Training Courses To Open Sept. 18

Fieldcrest's semi-annual series of departmental management courses for supervisors and staff personnel will begin the week of September 18.

The courses will again be under the joint auspices of Fieldcrest and the Vocational Education Division of the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction. The State will issue certificates to enrollees who complete a course.

The courses to be offered and the instructors are as follows: Industrial Statistics, William McGehee; Slide Rule, Donald R. Warren; Quality Control—Karastan, W. D. Hicks; "Notehand" (a simplified system of shorthand), Odell Nassar; and Cost Control—Bleachery and Finishing Mill, R. M. Fuller, Jr.

With the exception of Industrial Statistics, which will meet from 4:00 p. m. to 6:00 p. m. on Mondays, all of the courses are to be given in the evening.
