He worked as a warper tender until he was promoted to spooler fixer in 1958. He continued to work as a spooler fixer until his latest promotion.



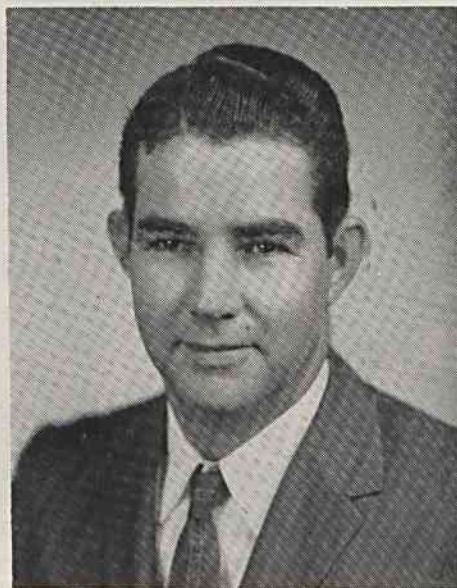
This group gave outstanding response to solicitations in Community Fund campaign.

Bedspread Mill Again Is Winner Of Plaque
