## Account Statements Sent By Credit Union


Semi-annual statements from the Fieldcrest Mills Credit Union are being distributed this week to all members of the credit union. The statements, covering the last six months of 1962, show the members' share accounts, the amount of dividends credited, interest paid and unpaid loan balances.

If any member has not received his statement by the end of this week or if there is any question concerning his account, the member should get in touch with the Credit Union office.

The Credit Union has paid a 4 per cent per annum dividend on savings each six months since it was organized over four years ago. The dividends are figured on the members' average monthly balances and are credited to their share accounts.

Credit Union officials remind the members that their statements should be retained for income tax purposes.
