Mr. and Mrs. Dickson are making their home at 326 West Virginia Avenue in Draper.

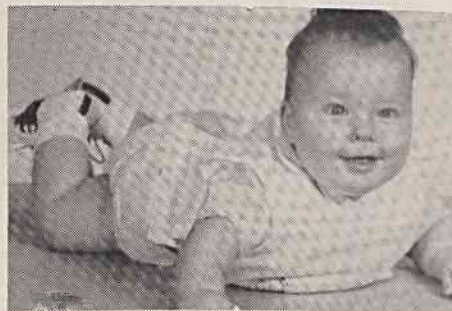
Glen Rorrer Has Fine Record Of Attendance

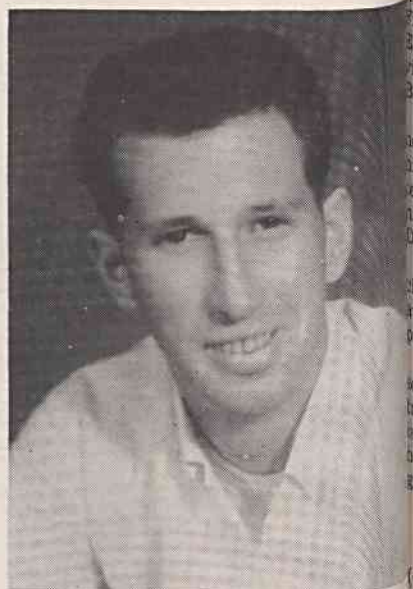

Employee's Son Takes Part In Naval Exercises

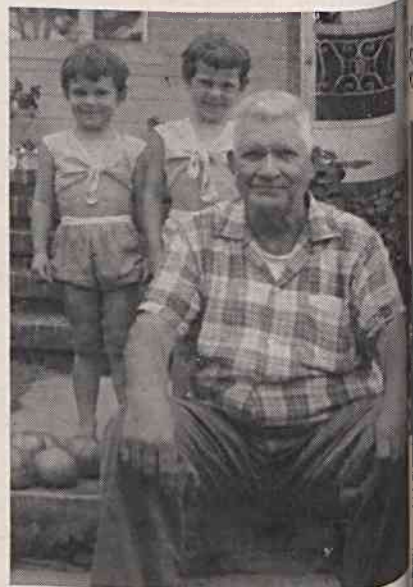


Wayne I. Cox, seaman, USN, is serving aboard the amphibious force ship USS ESTES, which operates out of San Diego, California.
