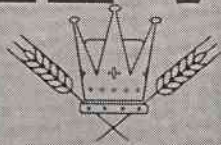

Klein Appointed Division Vice President

J. M. Norman, Jr., Mill Manager, Retires After Career Spanning History Of Karastan Rug Mill

The appointment of Fred W. Klein as division vice president—rug manufacturing has been announced by Harold W. Whitcomb, president of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc. Mr. Klein also was appointed manager of the Karastan Rug Mill, replacing J. M. Norman, Jr., who retired May 31.

Mr. Klein will report to Robert A. Harris, vice president—manufacturing of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc. Henry F. Morris, manager of the Karastan Spinning Division at Greenville, and John R. Mauney, manager of the Nye-Wait Di-

vision at Auburn, N. Y., will report to Mr. Klein as previously.

Since joining Fieldcrest in 1954, Mr. Klein has been assistant manager of the Karastan Rug Mill. Active in community affairs, he helped to organize the Meadow Greens Sanitary District and has served as chairman of the board of commissioners since the district was established in 1959.
