stan Service Center on Summit Road west of Draper. Storage racks are now being installed and it is expected that the new addition will be in use by the end of March.

The 43,200 square foot addition will add about one-third of the present space of the Karastan Service Center to help take care of the Karastan Mill's increased production and an expanding line of products.

Also to be occupied during March are new additions at the General Offices totaling 25,000 square feet and costing \$640,000. The exterior construction is complete and work is now under way on erecting the interior partitions.

The Data Processing, Traffic and Industrial Relations Departments are expected to move into the new sections during March. Other departments will be moved or rearranged in the vacated space in the original building as rapidly as the partition changes can be made.
