

## Towel Employee's Husband, Serving In Viet Nam, Receives Promotion



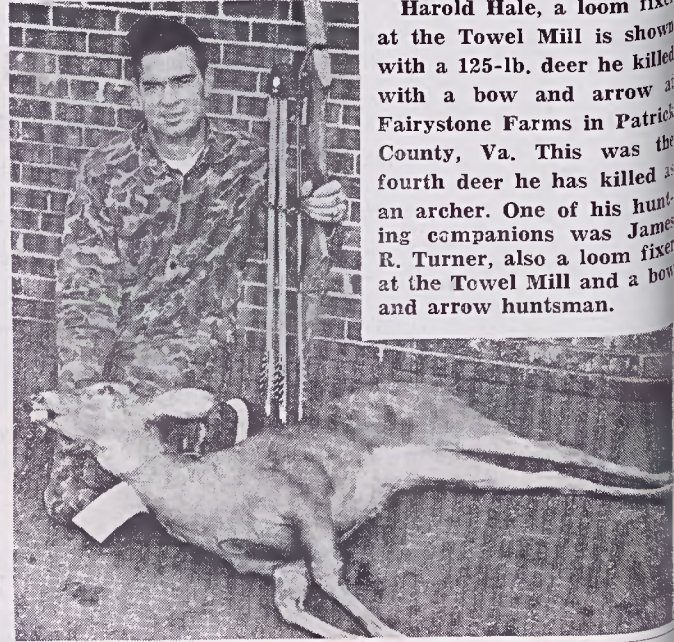

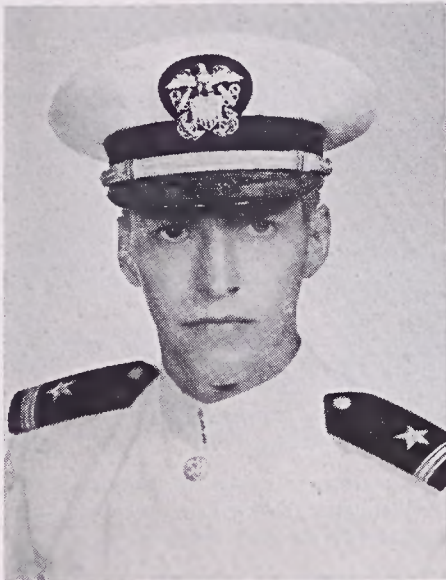
His wife, Janice Woods, is employed in the Production Control office of the Towel Mill, Fieldale.
