Mr. Harris, a native of Warren County, attended Campbell College for two years and was president of the student body. At the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, he majored in accounting and received his B. S. in commerce degree. He was elected to Phi Beta Kappa, national scholastic fraternity, and to Beta Gamma Sigma, the honor society for the School of Commerce.

He was an accountant with the U. S. Steel Corporation in Birmingham, Ala., before serving as a naval officer in World War II. As a lieutenant, he was commanding officer of a minesweeper and served in both the Atlantic and the Pacific.

He joined Fieldcrest Mills, Inc. in 1946 as a cost accountant and subsequently served in a number of staff and managerial positions.

He was assistant manager of the Blanket Mill, 1949-1954, and later was assistant comptroller and assistant treasurer. In May, 1955, he was elected secretary and treasurer and in June, 1956, he became vice president—manufacturing.
