

Privilege and Responsibility

Solicitations on behalf of the Community Fund will be conducted in the plants and offices in the Eden area October 21-25. Employees who are already signed up on a continuing basis will not be solicited, of course, but all others will be contacted and asked to pledge a contribution. The pledge can be paid in small installments through payroll deductions. The suggested basis of giving is the equivalent of one day's pay and a large percentage of employees have made such pledges.

The community-wide goal in the campaign is \$97,500, representing the budget needs for the next year of the 11 health, welfare and recreational agencies that receive support from the Community Fund. A well-organized campaign is seeking contributions from all employed persons in Eden at their places of employment. As at Fieldcrest, employees in other businesses and industries are being asked to contribute on the day's pay basis, which is considered the Fair Share in consideration of the needs of the community.

Fieldcresters can assure the success of the campaign by contributing generously as they have in the past. If you are not now signed up for a continuing deduction, won't you pledge a Fair Share in this year's drive? By doing so you will be joining with your fellow workers and fellow citizens in taking
