New YMCA Building Plans Announced

G. William Moore, president of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc., has been named honorary general chairman of the new YMCA Building Committee. W. D. Lashley, president of Lashley's, Inc., will serve as general chairman.

The appointments were announced last week by the board of directors of Central YMCA, Eden.

Other officials of the new YMCA building fund announced were Manley Joyce of Leaksville Bank and Trust Co., who earlier had been appointed treasurer of the building fund; and Douglas Craddock of Radio WLOE, appointed chairman of the site committee.

The members of the finance committee and the building committee are to be announced later, Jesse M. Burton, president of the Central YMCA executive committee, said.

The need for a new building has long

been recognized by the YMCA's board of directors. The present building on Warehouse Street was erected in 1909. For many years the building was recognized as outstanding and was able to serve the needs of the smaller population of the period.

The need for additional space has become increasingly apparent in recent years and the equipment is known to be entirely out-of-date.

Space for parking cars is practically non-existent and land for expansion of outdoor play areas, including space for tennis courts, playing fields and other facilities, is not available near the "Y."

After careful study, the board of directors has begun the formulation of an organization to obtain a new and modern family YMCA.
