Melvin L. Smith, assistant foreman in the Cutting and Sewing Department at the Blanket Finishing Mill, was promoted to foreman of the Channel Blanket Department at the same mill.

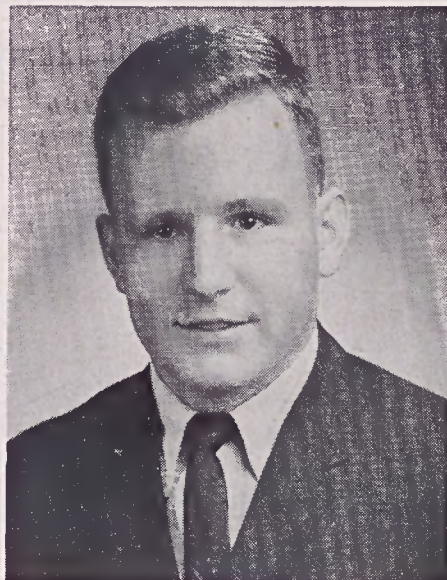
R. W. Harris Named Assistant Superintendent

Robert W. Harris has been appointed assistant superintendent of the Bedspread Finishing Mill effective February 1. He will report to J. P. Foster, superintendent of the Bedspread Finishing Mill.

Mr. Harris joined Fieldcrest as a management trainee in June, 1964, at the Fieldale Towel Mill. He was assistant foreman of the Towel Dyeing Department for about six months and then was transferred to the Bedspread Grey Mill as foreman of the Dyeing, Winding and Fringe Manufacturing Department. In the latter part of 1967, he trained A. D. Robertson to take over the foreman position.

In February, 1968, Mr. Harris was made an advanced management trainee in order to broaden his background, especially in weaving. He was first assigned a special project to break a slashing bottleneck by developing a system of counting in sets at the back of the slasher.

He was next trained in loom fixing, worked with overhaulers and a loom fixer, and for several months prior to

his latest appointment was a lead assistant foreman in the Weaving Department.
