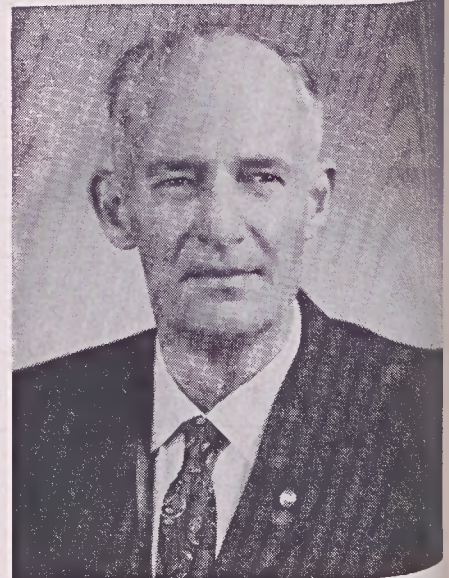

Foster Has Attained 40 Years Of Service



Charles Marvin Foster of the Karastan Service Center completed 40 years of continuous service with the Company Tuesday, March 25. He was presented the Fieldcrest diamond and gold 40-year service emblem and a letter of commendation from G. William Moore, president of Fieldcrest Mills, Inc.

Mr. Foster, a native of Stella, Va., joined the company March 25, 1929 as a time keeper in the Karastan Weave Room. In 1936, he became an office clerk in the Karastan Shipping Department, and in 1938 was made second hand. Immediately prior to entering the Army in 1942 he was second hand and order clerk.

Following his service in World War II, Mr. Foster returned to Karastan as a schedule clerk in 1945 and in 1954 became a shipping order clerk. Since 1956, he has been sample production control clerk.
